Introduction:

During the Generation Equality Forum (GEF) in Mexico and under the framework of the Economic Justice and Rights Action Coalition, the Government of Mexico, through the National Institute of Women (INMUJERES), and UN Women announced the Global Alliance for Care (GAC) as an urgent action to create a space where governments, private sector, international institutions, civil society organizations, youth and the philanthropic sector engage and make concrete commitments to advance the care work agenda globally.

The Global Alliance for Care's **objective** is to increase women's economic empowerment by fostering the creation of care systems, promoting the transformation of gender roles, and accelerating an equitable economic recovery in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic through implementing and/or increasing commitments and concrete actions on care.

A GAC engagement strategy has been designed to mobilize the interest of diverse organizations and stakeholders. The aim is to arrive at the GEF in Paris with a robust set of partners committed to generating transformative change in care work.

In preparation for this process, the Government of Mexico and UN Women are convening a meeting with stakeholders interested in engaging in this new Alliance for Care. The meeting will be held on 21 June 2021 (8.00 to 10.30 am, Mexico City Time), aiming at:

- Exploring a set of potential commitments and allies in the diverse areas of the care work agenda per sector.
- Sharing experiences and good practices amongst GAC's participants to understand the spectrum of potential commitments better.
- Preparing for the GAC's presence in the GEF in Paris and beyond.





Methodology

The meeting will include representation from governments, the private sector, global civil society, international organizations, youth, and philanthropic organizations.

- A first segment will be held at the leadership level for partners to share their interests, expectations, and potential areas of commitment.
- At the technical level (by invitation only), a second segment will identify a set of common elements or criteria for defining commitments. Best practices in care work will be shared, drawing on a typology proposed by the conveners.
- Speakers will have their cameras on during their intervention
